CAFOD: This week we want to say a massive thank you to all those people who've donated money to the Community Food Pantry. We wish we could thank each of you personally - but we can't since the donations are usually anonymous! Two people we can thank personally, however, are Chris and Veronica Swann, who collected £40 in donations at their Soup Lunch last week. We're very grateful for your support. Every single penny you give us is spent on the weekly shopping runs done by the Community Food Pantry volunteers, where they pick up not just the food we provide from the pantry but also essential personal hygiene and household cleaning products for those in need.

Community Food Pantry Update: The uptake of food for the food pantry continues to grow and we found the demand was so high last week that we had to do a shop three times the size we normally do. But thanks to the generosity of the congregation and surrounding community, especially those who celebrated their First Communions in July, we had enough money to do a very large shop for the pantry and also still deliver the 100+ items that were needed at AidBox Community (ABC). As we dropped the food at ABC, four families were in the hub and were able to put together a meal each for two days, as well as stocking up on hygiene essentials. It was touching and humbling to see your generosity in action - truly helping individuals who need it.

Where do I leave food donations? Please put food donations either in the clear box labelled "Community Food Pantry Donation Box" at the back of the church or in the box outside the front door of the Presbytery. How do I donate money? There is a "Food Pantry" button on the Donation Point inside the church if you would like to make monetary donations by card. Or you can give cash to Mgr Massey or put it in an envelope through Jenny Glester's door at 57 Egerton Road.
