MGR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

I don't usually comment on politics because there are good Catholics who for various reasons support different political parties. I certainly wouldn't put my political views at the forefront of my preaching; my role is to proclaim the Gospel and not to promote one party or another. Over the years I can tell you that I have, at different elections, voted for all three main political parties.

The realisation this week that we will have a new Prime Minister within a few days is not necessarily a cause for celebration, but a sadness as to the instability of the government. Different commentators will no doubt put the blame at the door of different people and parties, but the reality is the instability that we currently see is not good for anyone. The anxiety that this generates in the public leads to anxieties at home and affects both adults and children. The level of issues of mental health problems over the last few years has been heightened by the pandemic and lockdown, and we are seeing the effects of this in children as well as adults.

So one of the positive things that we can do at this time is to pray for our politicians, that the decisions they make over the coming weeks are based on the needs of the country rather than their own political gains.

Hopefully then we can work together to work for peace and justice at home and overseas. The Gospel recognises that there will always be conflicts, but that we are called to be bridge builders and fence menders. So let us pray for those in Government and in fact for all our politicians. It is easy to sit in an armchair and criticise, but surely it is even better to ask the Holy Spirit to help sort it out.
