MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

Yesterday I was at a meeting, for most of the day, on the new Lectionary which is due to come into force from 1st Sunday of Advent. We're about 40 priest present and we listened to a very interesting presentation by Martin Foster who leads the liturgy department of the Bishop conference. The Lectionary is a series of books which has all the approved scripture readings for all the Masses and for the celebration of the Sacraments. This new Lectionary uses a new translation of the scriptures and has been a 'work in progress' for almost 10 years. This translation is called the English Standard Version and is being used by the Bishop Conferences of England & Wales as well as South Africa, Scotland and South Africa.

Like any major biblical work once it has been translated into another language that version has to be approved by the Vatican. Added to this is the fact that any changes made to it have to be approved by people who produced the translation as they have the copyright to this version. So you can understand there's quite a bit of to-ing and fro-ing between various different groups before agreement can be finalised.

The present lectionary was produced in 1981 and was itself originally started in the early 70s as we can all imagine things change over 50 year period. For example a number of new saints have been made and Masses for them need to be added. So it was felt that a new translation and a new approach would be a benefit for all.

Most of the time you won't notice a great deal of change, because the scriptures are still the same Scriptures but translations and translators often use different words in each addition. English being such a rich language often has many ways of saying the same thing. You may find that sometimes you will prick up your ears because a well known piece of scripture now sounds a bit different.

So if you use a Missal you will need to get a new version which will be on sale in the Autumn.
