MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

There's not the slightest doubt as to what has been the highlight of the week for me. It took place at Clifton Cathedral at midday on Wednesday. In front of two Cardinals and some 30 bishops as well as the papal Nuncio, I was one of about 100 priests and 70 deacons who were there to witness and be involved in the ordination of Canon Bosco McDonald to be the 10th Bishop of the Clifton Diocese.

Together with the great, the good, and the ordinary, we witnessed an incredibly moving, uplifting and dignified service which lasted almost two and a half hours. Bishop Bosco looked incredibly relaxed during the whole proceedings. It helped that having been the parish priest of the cathedral, it was a building he knew well, and he was surrounded by his clergy, a group of people that he also knows well. In many cases a new Bishop for a diocese is an external appointment. so that at the ordination the new man is in an unfamiliar setting, surrounded by people he hardly knows. Because it was 'one of our own' being ordained, it had an extra special feeling for most of those who were present.

Just as Bishop Declan was not a major change from Bishop Mervyn, then most of us expect Bishop Bosco will build on the work of his predecessors. However, I'm also sure he will be his own man, as he needs to be, in leading the diocese. People look to their Bishop for leadership and guidance and I'm confident that our new Bishop will supply this. Because he has spent nearly all his life in the diocese, this enables him to hit the ground running. However, it is a big step up

so please do (as he has asked us to do) keep him in your prayers.
