What a great day last Sunday was! We had a church almost full to the brim as we enrolled 40 children into this year's First Holy Communion programme. This was followed by a party in the parish hall. Again, we had good numbers of people there, and professional entertainer kept the children engaged for well over an hour. There were many screams of delight, giggles and applause as he performed his various tricks for the edification. Meanwhile parents and guardians were able to mingle and chat, knowing that their children were safe and happy. As I walked around chatting and listening, I was aware that what I was seeing was one big happy family. As a parish priest, one of the things that always encourages me is seeing the joy of family life lived out in a Christian environment.

With terrible details of the murders of three children in Southport being revealed this week, we recognise just how lucky we are. We also recognise that the parents of those who were killed and injured have been traumatised in a way that we can hardly comprehend. So whilst our hearts go out to those who have suffered violence and death in their family lives, we are called to pause for a moment and count our blessings.

So maybe this weekend you will find a few moments to thank God for all that you have. Many people in our world are living in war torn areas, or are facing intolerable hardships due to corruption and dictatorships. May the God of love help them and us to find ways to build a better world for our children

When the box is full, Recycling for Good Causes arranges its collection and each item is assessed and recycled by their experts to get the highest price possible for our designated charity, CAFOD.
