## MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

As we approach Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent, I've also been involved with three funerals, all of which are radically different. The first one was for a good and faithful servant 'Harold'. You would see him at the entrance to the church giving out hymn books and orders of service for the 10 o'clock Mass on a Sunday morning, or standing there with a basket for a second collection at the end of Mass. No matter what the weather, or how he was feeling, he was almost always on duty with a ready smile for young and old alike.

The second funeral is for Anthony, and this is taking place at St. Augustine of Canterbury Church in Downend. He died in Japan and some of his ashes have been brought back and will be buried in the same grave as his brother, but because many of his friends could not go to his funeral, we're having a special Mass for him before the burial of the ashes.

The third funeral is a simple graveside service for another person called Anthony. This is a simple service at the cemetery prior to his body being laid to rest in the family grave. It was his decision that all he wanted was something short and simple and that is exactly what he will get.

So, we have three sets of families all grieving for the loss of a loved one, and all having very different types of service. People sometimes think about catholic funerals are a bit of a production line, and that everyone has the same thing. This is far from the reality. Each service is truly unique, in that it reflects the wishes of the individual and their family and is designed to help them navigate their grief. What is essential for one family is often totally different to what is essential for another.

It's a good number of years ago that I stopped worrying about what was correct or appropriate at a funeral. The good Lord will not be that worried about the funeral service. He will judge the individual on how they lead their life and not on what was said or done at their funeral. Ash Wednesday is a good time for us to once again think about how we are living our lives because one day we will be judged.
