MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

I had my sister and brother-in-law staying with me last Sunday evening as they were on their way back to their home in Surrey having been in Cardiff to see one of their sons and four of their grandchildren. It's always good to have family around and to spend a bit of time chatting. I was also able to share with them the fact that when I retire it has now been confirmed that I will be living in the flat above the ground floor rooms and offices. So whilst I will still be living here, I will not be involved with the parish, but merely be a tenant and paying rent to the parish for their accommodation. Well actually I won't be paying the rent, but the diocese in the form of its provision for retired clergy, will be paying.

The Advantage of this for me is I don't have to pack up and move, having been a priest for 37 years. I have changed address at least 11 times so whilst I'm well used to packing and moving, it doesn't get any easier as the years go by.

The advantage for the parish is that they get an income for a space that would be hard to let, and also, someone on site just to show that the building is being occupied.

Finally, the advantage to the diocese is because whilst they will be paying the rent, that also means that the parish income will go up and the 'Tax' that the parish pays on its income will go up. The diocese will give with one hand but also take back a proportion with the other. In some ways this is a bit like what happens to us during lent. We do extra for the Lord, but the reward is that we grow in our trust and love for God, so we give with one hand but receive blessings on the other hand.
