MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

Late on Sunday afternoon my plans for the week were severely disrupted when the four-day cruise that I was due to go on on Monday was cancelled. The cruise liner has gone in for a refit and this was taking longer than was planned. Instead, I went to stay with my sister and brother-in-law who should've been on the same cruise as me and we had good few days together.

But of course, the real story of this week was the very sudden, and to a great extent, unexpected death of Pope Francis. The tributes that came from all over the world, and not just from Christians, were a clear indication of the high esteem in which he was held. Seldom in history do we see people of such high rank being so close to their everyday. As Francis himself said, he wanted the clergy of the church to have the smell of the sheep, in other words he wanted them to be close to those they serve.

What history will eventually make of Francis's Pontificate is far too early to say. It will, to some extent, be dependent on who his successor is. If he is someone who has the same humble outlook, then Francis could well be seen as the leader of a new style of running the Church. Hopefully his vision of a synodal church will also be carried forward. Certainly, our Bishop and in fact most, if not all of the Bishops of England and Wales, see this as a way to reinvigorate the Church.

So as we are glued to the television on Saturday watching Francis's funeral from the Vatican, let us also pray for whoever may succeed him. No matter how prepared you may feel, running a Church of 1.6 billion people is an unenviable task for anyone.

In the meantime, may Francis rest in peace and rise in glory with the saints.
