MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

This weekend, we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the first outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the early church. Up till then, the apostles were not really aware of the third person of the blessed Trinity, all they really knew was that they were going to get "another helper." So you can see why it took almost 300 years for this "helper" to be really defined by the theologians of the church. It was 1800 years ago in 325 in the city of Nicaea in Greece, that the churches of the east and the west met to discuss a number of issues. Mainly to do with the relationship between Father and Son but also the place of the Holy Spirit.

Today we are better informed and have a clearer understanding of the Holy Spirit, but that doesn't mean we know what the Spirit is any more that we know what the Father is. Thankfully, knowledge is not the same as belief; so we believe in the Trinity, even though we may struggle to clearly explain the idea of three parts in one God.

What me know for certain is that the Holy Spirit certainly turbo charged the early church and gave the founding Fathers the courage and passion to preach to the whole world. The same Spirit also enabled those who heard their words to recognise, in their deepest core, that what was being said made sense, even if they couldn't fully explain it.

Just remember that you cannot fully explain what love is, and since God is love you can't fully explain the Trinity. What we know is, that when we know we are loved, we feel better and act better.

This Jubilee year, people across the world are uniting in solidarity to demand action on the debt crisis. The world is currently facing one of the most acute debt crises in history with 54 countries - from Kenya to Sri Lanka – facing debt distress. Despite significant poverty burdens, countries are having to make huge repayments on high-interest loans to wealthy banks, institutions and governments, leaving them unable to properly fund essential services. Debts are being paid at the expense of hiring doctors and teachers, building schools, hospitals
