MONSIGNOR BERNARD'S MESSAGE

As I move into the final few months before my retirement certain dates and feasts remind me of my priestly journey. Today (Friday) we celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart, and on Sunday we will celebrate the feast of Saints Peter & Paul.

The Sacred Heart was the name of the first primary school I attended. I was there for a couple of years before my home parish (Holy Family) opened its Primary School in September 1958. I remember the Sacred Heart Church as a large and impressive building run by the Jesuits. The other Sacred Heart is the one in Westbury-on-Trym where I was Parish Priest. I have many happy memories from my time there, and knowing both parish communities, I am sure they will work together collaboratively once I retire.

The feast of Ss Peter and Paul reminds me of course of our Cathedral. When I bought my 3rd house and lived in Long Ashton I used to attend the Cathedral.

One thing that stood out for me that time, was the weekly newsletter and the articles that were written by the then Monsignor Crispin Hollis, the style of which I have tried to copy over the years. Trying to give you a bit of an insight into aspects of my life and relating that to the scriptures.

The Cathedral was also the place where I was ordained on the 9th of April 1988. Never in my wildest dreams did I expect to have achieved things that I have over these past 37 years. The places that I have worked, both in the diocese and overseas, have all shaped me into the person I am today.

I see myself as a pebble that has been down a stream and, in the hurly-burly, edges have been knocked off, and the pebble has been polished so that it looks significantly different to when it first entered the stream back in '88.

However, I recognise that this pebble will only find its final true beauty when it leaves the stream of this earth and goes hopefully to heaven. If the Lord lets me in, then it will be in no small part due to the love that I have received from those I have encountered in the whole of my life. We are all part of God's family, and He uses us to help us to shape one another.
